Since 1988, the SWRCB has contracted with the HCA in order for HCA/Environmental Health's Hazardous Materials Specialists to conduct regulatory oversight for cleanup of leaking underground storage tanks (USTs) in Orange County (except for the cities of Anaheim, Fullerton and Santa Ana). Funds from this agreement provide personnel services, operating costs and travel expenses necessary to conduct oversight of corrective actions and perform regulatory and administrative activities related to unauthorized releases from USTs. Approving acceptance of award of this grant agreement will continue the local oversight of cleanup projects at properties that have been contaminated by leaking underground petroleum tanks that impact both local groundwater supplies and public health.

Supervisor Sarmiento requests Clerk of the Board to add a supplemental agenda item be placed on the May 21, 2024, Board of Supervisors meeting, to adopt and recognize "Silicosis Awareness Month" for the month of June and adding this recognition to the list of Recurring Resolutions.

<u>Draft Silicosis Resolution/Proclamation- declaring June Silicosis Awareness</u> Month

WHEREAS, silicosis, a progressive, severe lung disease caused by the inhaling of silica dust particles is an important and preventable occupational lung disease in the United States and worldwide, and in recent years has been noted to affect individuals who fabricate countertops; and

WHEREAS, over 132 silicosis cases were identified in California since 2019 amongst engineered stone fabrication workers, with 82 from Los Angeles County, and 33 identified from other counties of Southern California, and at least 13 fatalities; and

WHEREAS, silicosis lung disease has been considered to have long latency (greater than 20 years), and in the case of engineered stone workers can occur with much shorter latency (less than 10 years) and can contribute and progress to lung transplant or death in younger workers; and

WHEREAS, inhalation of silica dust can also worsen preexisting cardiovascular disease, pulmonary tuberculosis, chronic obstructive disease, cancer, autoimmune disease, and kidney disorders; and

WHEREAS, most identified cases in California are young Latino immigrant men in their 30's and 40's; and

WHEREAS, many workers in the field of stone fabrication are unaware of the health dangers of silica exposure; and

WHEREAS, medical provider awareness of the disease is low, with symptomatic individuals potentially receiving delayed diagnosis; and

WHEREAS, primary prevention to control respirable crystalline silica dust remains the most important way to address silicosis; and

WHEREAS, education and awareness campaigns are needed to increase awareness, reduce exposures, and improve early disease detection and secondary prevention in the community;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Orange County Board of Supervisors does hereby declare the month of June as Silicosis Awareness Month to increase education and awareness in the community. We urge Orange County to be more aware of the dangers of silica exposure, safety measures that can be taken, screening that should be performed for those who are exposed and linkage to care for those who have had exposure and who have symptoms.

JOHN WAYNE AIRPORT CELEBRATES FLY FRIENDLY PROGRAM AND RECOGNIZES 2023 WINNERS

SANTA ANA, Calif. – John Wayne Airport (JWA) proudly acknowledges the outstanding contributions of General Aviation (GA) jet operators in the 2023 Fly Friendly Program year. This initiative, aimed at reducing noise and encouraging sustainable aviation practices, marks its second year promoting community-friendly operations.

Supervisor Katrina Foley, Fifth District, lauded the collaborative efforts of those involved in shaping a program responsive to local needs. "I commend the dedication of participating pilots to noise mitigation and eco-conscious flying, which aligns with my commitment to being a good neighbor," she emphasized. "I want to thank the pilots, community members, and Airport staff who have supported our efforts to build a program inclusive of the needs of the community and investing in best practices that moderate noise impacts and promote greener, cleaner flights."

The 2023 Fly Friendly recognition recipients include GA jet operators across the four tiers of the program. Their commitment reflects the broader mission to embrace greener flight practices.

Airport Director Charlene Reynolds expressed enthusiasm for increasing program participation and its vital role in fostering community awareness. "Outreach and education will be pivotal in expanding pilot engagement and promoting best practices," she affirmed.

JWA already has one of the most stringent aircraft noise monitoring programs in the United States. The voluntary Fly Friendly Program, launched in August 2022, is an education and

outreach program that builds upon existing regulations to educate GA jet operators and seek voluntary adoption of best practices for sustainable environmental aviation.

Throughout the year, GA jet operators are evaluated on the following actions:

- Avoiding nighttime and early-morning operations when possible;
- Producing the least amount of measurable noise per year;
- Engaging pilots with noise abatement education, distributing Fly Friendly materials, and/or attending Orange County community meetings focused on aviation impacts; and
- Contributing toward ecological restoration and habitat enhancement projects through the Irvine Ranch Conservancy or Newport Bay Conservancy.


